Pica

If you have taken a typing class you know about pica type. The definition is “type size equal to 12 points (4.2 mm); a size of letter in typewriting with 10 characters to the inch.” This article is written in pica type (unless Mary does something to shrink it in the bulletin, which she often has to). But this article is not about pica type. It is about another definition of a word spelled the same way. This is a meaning I had never heard of until I ran across it in a book I was reading but I thought it could be used as a good bulletin illustration.

The other “pica” is a “tendency or craving to eat substances other than normal food (such as clay, plaster, ashes, or ...).” It is said to occur during childhood or pregnancy (remember those weird cravings?), or as a symptom of disease. The word comes from the Latin for the “magpie” – a bird that will eat almost anything. While pica is not unusual it is not really common in healthy adults either.

Spiritual pica, on the other hand, is a very common occurrence. The spiritual craving for a Christian is to “hunger and thirst for righteousness” and the “bread of life” which is Christ. Healthy Christians seek this nourishment in their daily diet. But when disease sets in, pica is a symptom. As people turn from Christ their diet takes on the inedible garbage of hollow arguments that fill but do not nourish.

It is my prayer that we will be filled with the solid food from God that is intended to mature and sustain us.

It is ok for your typewriter (if anybody still has one of those) to have pica as long as you don't.
