Which One

It is not often there is anything memorable on television, especially one of the network dramas, but I heard a line on one that stuck with me. One of the actors repeated the line, "All men are born as many men; they die as only one." It sounded like an excerpt from some article or book but I was unable to find it on the internet – I just can't believe such an idealistic statement would come from a TV writer, but strange things happen sometimes. I am not sure what the author was getting at but I thought there was a pretty profound bulletin article found in the words.

"All men are born as many men," indicates the potential that lies within each of us. When we are born we are undefined. We are just cute (well, most of us) babies. No baby is born a doctor, lawyer, garbage collector, or ditch digger. Our parents may have some expectations but those don't always pan out; we wind up making our own decisions, taking our own paths, and taking directions from which there is little opportunity to return – in the secular world at least. I suppose what attracted my attention to the quotation is a conversation I had with an individual who was regretting the decisions he had made that left him in a job he disliked. He was looking for a way out. It sounded much like my wife's husband a few years ago.

We go from "many men" to "only one" by that series of decisions we make and when we approach the time of death we are identifiable. We are known by our mates, our children, our work, and our play. Someone who never met you could pick you out of a crowd just by knowing your history of decisions – both good and bad. One person – unique in all the world. I can tell you, however, that nothing is over until it is over. Just because you don't think you can change does not mean you can't. Some people have had work that made them miserable in the automobile industry and found the way out by going into a photography business. Even though that was satisfying, it was not the way he wanted to spend the rest of his life, so he went to preaching school. I think I will stick with it.

Spiritually, those millions of choices are pared down to two. We will be defined by our relationship with Satan or with Jesus. You were born with two choices, you will die with only one – which one will it be?
