Ghost Towns

It is amazing how many ghost towns there are in Yavapai county. From Crown King, to Jerome, to Crook City, to Meesville, the county is filled with them. Most (I did not look at all) are there because sometime in the past the promise of riches gave way to the curse of hard work with no reward – in other words, the mines played out. In some cases there is nothing remaining but scarred earth, others have turned themselves into thriving tourist attractions but none are at their heyday level activity. As interesting as all the places are, none compare to Ordos, China.

Filled with lavish, beautiful government projects, the city boasts 20,000 full time inhabitants – hardly the normal definition of a "ghost town." The "ghost" effect comes from the comparison of the actual population to the hoped for residency of over a million people. Rather than the people moving in to seek riches, it was the government and landowners who were trying to gain wealth by attracting people to the new city. They priced themselves out of the market with high rents and costly building projects. The result: a large beautiful city with almost no residents and structures that are falling apart from lack of upkeep. Dreams were destroyed through lack of insight and greed.

Jesus had some parables warning people about those things. Some built houses on sand, others tore down barns just to build bigger ones, still others were told to "count the cost" of their actions. Where and what we build are very important to our relationships with the world and with Jesus. We seek to find a lasting city where we can live eternally. Jesus has one of those and it will never be a ghost town or a tourist town. It can only be a home town.
